



The word token is derived from the Anglo-Saxon *tacn*, which means a sign, presage, type, or representation, that which points out something; and this is traced to *toecan*, to teach, show, or instruct, because by a token we show or instruct others as to what we are.

In Masonry, the grip of recognition is called a token because it is an outward sign of the covenant of friendship and fellowship entered into between the members of the Fraternity, and is considered as a memorial of that covenant, which was made, when it was first received by candidate, between him and the Order into which he was initiated.
