

Masonic History

B. Chris Ruli, FPS, is one of the living authorities on the Masonic career of Washington's dear friend, the Marquis de Lafayette. His recent article, "The Masonic Music and Poetry of Lafayette's American Tour, 1824–1825," details the enthusiastic reception of the Marquis de Lafayette during his final goodwill tour of the United States. As a revered hero of the American Revolution and a fellow Freemason, Lafayette's arrival in August 1824 sparked widespread excitement, particularly among Masonic lodges nationwide.

Grand Lodges and their constituent bodies organized numerous events, including banquets and balls, to honor Lafayette. A key aspect of these celebrations was the creation and performance of unique Masonic-themed music and poetry. These works, often reproduced in public newspapers and Masonic proceedings, celebrated Lafayette's service to America and his deep connection to Freemasonry, while also highlighting the fraternity's core values.

Notable examples include "Fayette's Return," performed at the Grand Lodge of New York's banquet, and "Lafayette, the Loved Mason," sung in Maryland. In Cincinnati, Lafayette Lodge even surprised him with honorary membership and a specially composed "Ode to Lafayette." Brother Ruli emphasizes that these artistic tributes, though less common today, offer invaluable insights into early 19th-century Masonic culture and its public engagement.
