



From the South

Freemasonry is a fraternal organization that traces its roots back to the late 16th century and has been involved in a number of historic events. Here are a few significant Freemason events that took place in March:

- The formation of the first Grand Lodge of Freemasonry: On March 25th, 1717, four London lodges came together to form the first Grand Lodge of Freemasonry. This marked a significant turning point in the organization's history, as it brought about greater standardization and organization within the fraternity.
- 2. The death of George Washington: George Washington, one of the most famous Freemasons in history, passed away on December 14th, 1799. However, it wasn't until March 14th, 1800, that his funeral was held at Mount Vernon.
- 3. : On March 6th, 1761, the first Masonic temple in America was consecrated in Boston, Massachusetts.
