

Masons in History

The Marquis de Lafayette was a French aristocrat and military officer who played a significant role in both the American and French Revolutions.

Lafayette entered Freemasonry in 1775. He was a Royal Arch Mason and a member of the Knights Templar. In the Scottish Rite, he received degrees in the Cerneau Supreme Council of NY and was made a 33rd degree Mason and Honorary Grand Commander.

Lafayette's early Masonic membership is debated, with some accounts suggesting he was made a Mason in France before arriving in America, while others suggest his initiation occurred in America, potentially at a military lodge in Morristown, New Jersey, or at Valley Forge. Regardless of the exact timing and location, Lafayette's Masonic involvement is well-documented.

General Lafayette visited America in 1824-25 and was receive with great aplomb. While at a cornerstone ceremony in South Carolina he was welcomed by Abraham DeLeon, Worshipful Master of Kershaw Lodge No. 29 in their native French language.



Lafayette being overjoyed at this reception removed his Grand Masters Jewel of France, approached Bro. DeLeon and placed it around his neck as a personal gift and souvenir.

This medal presently resides at Mariner's Lodge No. 2 in Charleston SC.

Lafayette faced challenges in his own country during the French revolution. As a moderate, he attempted to straddle the line between prevalent radical ideas and his own more centrist perspective.

He led the assault on the Bastille and sent his friend George Washington the massive iron key taken from its gate. Later however, he publicly denounced demands to behead King Louis and Queen Marie Antoinette.
