



From the West

Brethren,

I very much enjoy reading stories about the interaction of members of our fraternity, regardless of their individual stations in life. One of my recent finds is set in the early days of the American Civil War, and originated with the Zerubbabel Lodge #15, in Savannah. There was no mention whether Lodge #15 was the Lodge in the story. I have paraphrased the story for brevity.

Not long after Fort Sumter, Northern troops were dispatched to the Savannah area and established themselves on the North side of the mouth of the Savannah River. A short time after the North encampment was established a messenger with a white flag approached the Confederate area South of the river mouth. It seems that the Union troops had among them a young man who had been raised to the Fellow Craft degree, before their unit departed for the Southern deployment. The Northern messenger asked if there was a Lodge that would be willing to test him in the Fellow Craft Degree and raise him to the sublime degree of Master Mason.

There was such a Lodge, and they were preparing for a Master Mason degree event. A few days later a detachment of Southern cavalry crossed the river and made their way to the Northern encampment, near Hilton Head. They escorted one Northern Fellow Craft and some number of Northern Master Masons back through 35 miles of Northern and Sothern defenses and to the Lodge. Records note that the Brother was indeed proficient in the Fellow Craft Degree, and he was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. That night another detail of Southern cavalry, no doubt Brothers to a man, escorted their Northern Brothers safely back to Hilton Head. (continued on page 5)
