



Masonic History and Esoterica

From Symbolism of the Blue Degrees of Freemasonry by Albert Pike's Esoterica:

Is the Cable-Tow a Symbol?

Cable-tow is a word not met with in the English language outside of Masonry. It is not treated or spoken as a symbol in Masonry; and the use to which in case of need it was, as I was told, intended to be put, divests it even of a semblance of a symbol.

In Hebrew, Khabel meant "a rope, cord, cable attached to an anchor; In Proverbs 23:34 and tu or to as a suffix meant "his."

In Ezekeil 18:12-16 and 23:15 and in Job 22:6 the same word, Khabel meant "binding", or "to bind as with a pledge."

And in Ezekiel 18:7, is the word Khabel tu, meaning his "pledge."

The length of one's Cable-tow "means therefore the scope and intent and spirit of one's pledge."

<u>NOTE</u>

With regards to the validity of the above information I would note that symbology and allegory are subjects open to individual interpretations. As Pike himself stated:

"Everyone is entirely free to reject and dissent from whatsoever herein may seem to him to be untrue or unsound." - Albert Pike, Preface to Morals and Dogma (Original Edition)
