

Brethren,

This month I recognize lessor known member of US Masonic history. Buffalo Bill Cody was born in LeClaire, Iowa, on February 26, 1846, but his family moved to Leavenworth, Kansas when he was still young. By age fourteen he already had a job as a rider for the Pony Express and joined the 9th Kansas Cavalry by the time he turned seventeen.

Three years later he married Louisa Frederici in St. Louis, but by then he was working as a scout providing buffalo meat for soldiers and railroad workers. That meant he was constantly on the move, but she had a lot of patience and managed to make the marriage work.

Buffalo Bill in Masonry and on Stage

At age 24 Buffalo Bill, as he was now known, became a Master Mason at Platte Valley Lodge No. 32 in Nebraska. Buffalo Bill founded his Wild West Show in 1883 and became a household name. While enjoying this life, he went on in Masonry to work his way through Royal Arch and the other York Rite degrees, culminating in his being dubbed a Knight Templar. He followed that by joining the Shriners, then rising through the 32 degrees of Scottish Rite. Clearly he reveled in being a Mason in every way he could.


