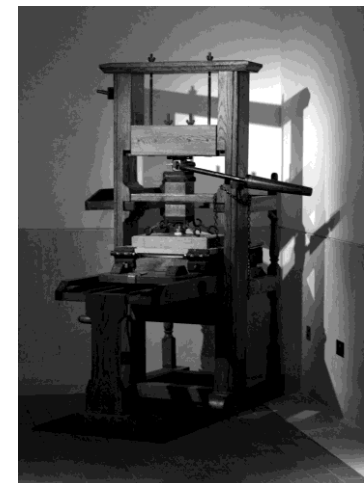

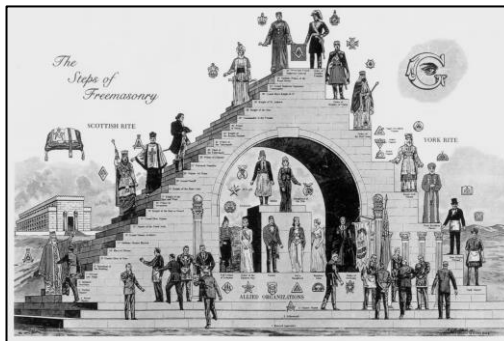

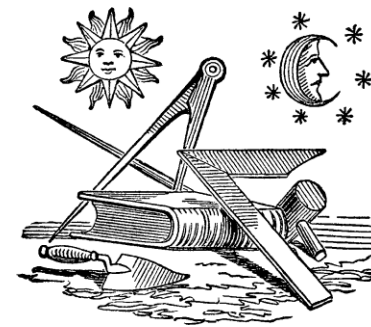

### Brothers of Note

Albert Mackey was born in Charleston in 1807. He was a physician, journalist and educator. He attended College of South Carolina (later to become University of South Carolina) in 1832, graduated from the medical department and was appointed in 1838 as demonstrator of anatomy.

In 1844, he devoted himself to writing on a variety of subjects including languages, the Middle Ages, and Freemasonry. This led to his investigation of abstruse symbolism, Cabalistic, and Talmudic research.

His writings on Freemasonry his were prodigious and include:

- A Lexicon of Freemasonry
- Tame True Mystic Tie
- The Ahiman Rezon of South Carolina
- Principles of Masonic Law
- Textbook of Masonic Jurisprudence
- History of Freemasonry in South Carolina
- Manual of the Lodge
- Encyclopedia of Freemasonry
- Masonic Parliamentary Law
